

(238,666 small businesses) in the state in danger of a tax hike simply because they chose to organize as a pass-through entity.





While Democrats claim that their tax hikes are aimed at the wealthy shareholders, these business owners employ 63% of the state's small business workforce, which would put an estimated 2,363,386 workers in danger.
